CUW Club Policies to Date

Here is a summary of the resolutions which have been passed by a vote of the CUW members. Since we do not yet have a club secretary to provide minutes, I've written this from memory. If you notice any inaccuracies or omissions, please let me know.

OCTOBER:

- A new club will be formed. Its name shall be the Commodore Users of Wichita.
- Meetings will be held the second Saturday of each month from 1:00 to 4:00 PM.
- Dues are set at \$10.00 per year for a family membership. For this amount, the family receives 1 vote on club policy, a monthly newsletter, and a quarterly disk publication. Other family members may vote by paying an additional \$5.00 per year.
- Club dues are in no way connected to the C&AUGW annual dues or 8-Bit SIG fees. With a single exception, dues will not be pro-rated based on membership in that other club.

NOVEMBER:

- Dues are raised to \$15.00 per year in order to cover equipment maintenance and purchases of hardware & software.
- Beginning in December, only members in good standing will be permitted to vote, to receive newsletters, and to utilize club services such as the software libraries.

METER SHOP


WATER TREATMENT PLANT HISTORICAL COWTOWN MUSEUM BOTANICAL GARDENS
